Our goal is to build a national cohesion and security infrastructure for the US, including an early warning/early action system, to prevent violent conflict.

<u>Important Update from TRUST Network's Media Monitoring Team and Founding Partner, PIRUSA:</u>

There have been signs of increased extremist activity over the last month, much of which seems to be associated with a rise in both the number and intensity of Covid-19-related protests. The number of anti-mask or anti-vaccination protests--usually related to either school mask mandates, vaccination mandates for health care workers, or requirements for proof of vaccination in the hospitality industry--has risen from an average of under 15 a week at the beginning of July to close to 50 a week by the end of the month.



The number of people attending such events also seems to be rising: whereas many anti-mask events a couple of months ago struggled to attract more than 10-15, we have been seeing protests in places like Redding and San Diego (both California),

as well as Oklahoma City, with well over 200 attendees. Many of the prominent figures at these demonstrations related to Covid-19 restrictions are the same

figures who were closely involved with 'Stop the Steal' events back in November and December of last year; beyond that, many of them have associations with violent extremist groups such as the Proud Boys and Patriot Prayer (though this does vary according to location, with the closest correlation probably being seen in the Portland-Vancouver area). Even the Three Percenters' flags and tattoos were seen in San Diego recently.

Another disquieting, but related, development has been the extent to which the violent "street-fighting culture" fringe of anti-state extremists has sought violent contact with their "enemies" on the left whom they deem with the blanket term "antifa." After several months of being inconspicuous, they have shown a renewed self-confidence in physical altercations with "antifa" and we have just seen this on successive weekends first in Portland and then LA. So far the casualties have been restricted to broken bones and one or two stabbings, but this appetite for direct physical clashes is worrying.

Community Call to Action

From the National Association for Community Mediation:

Congress is discussing a federal micro-grant program for community-based organizations, like you who promote peacebuilding, hate crime prevention, and dialogue to name just a few areas of focus. The current funding amount proposed is \$30 million for this program.

We encourage you to send a short note to Representative Grace Meng of the Commerce, Justice, Science, and Related Agencies (CJS) sub-committee in the U.S. House of Representatives. Rep. Meng has been the key advocate in Congress focused on developing this micro-grant opportunity. This proposal is contained in the CJS subcommittee's appropriations recommendations released in the FY 2022 funding bill earlier in July.

The bill represents a big win on funding. Community Relations Service (CRS) in this proposed budget is funded at \$22 million and again the bill creates a new \$30 million grant program for community-based organizations.
